Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.

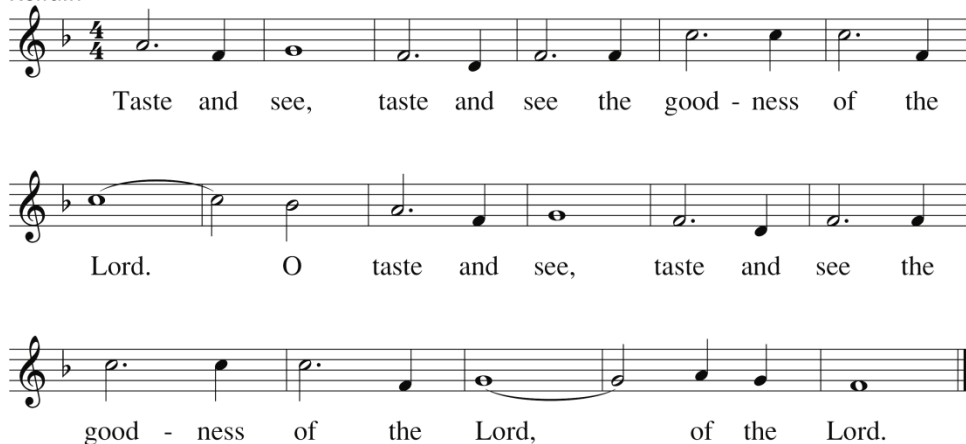
