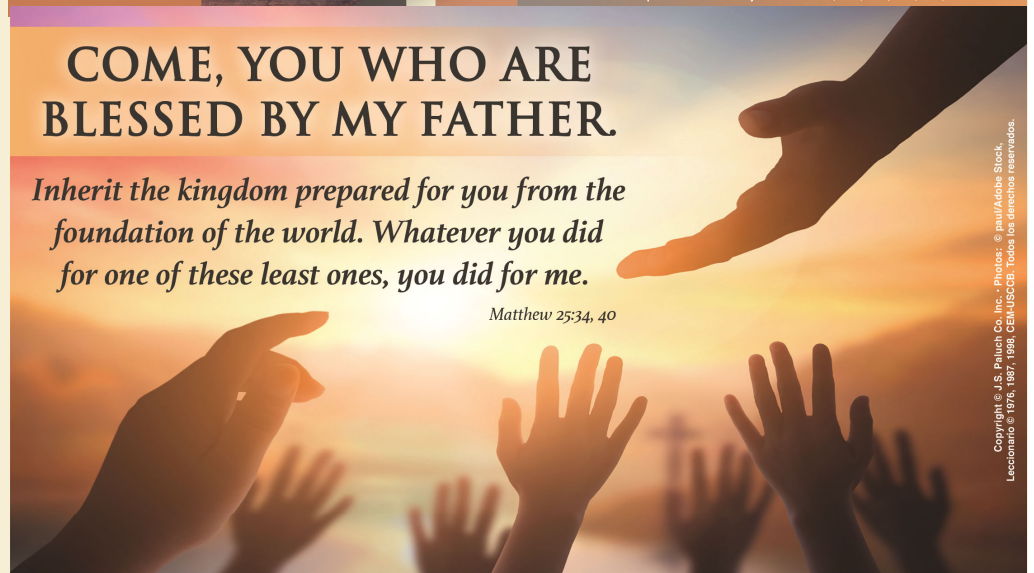

Renew My Church Announcement

Dear Parishioners of Our Lady of Hope,

As you know, *Renew My Church* (RMC) is the strategic initiative of the Archdiocese of Chicago to revitalize parishes in Cook and Lake Counties. Every parish in the Archdiocese is part of a "grouping": a cluster of parishes that plans how this renewal will look in its particular community. There are roughly 100 groupings throughout the Archdiocese and groupings have been activated since 2016. "Activation" is the commencement of the process whereby a committee consisting of priests and parishioners from each parish, along with Archdiocesan personnel, discern possible structural, operational and ministerial changes for the grouping.

Our grouping, as you may recall, consists of the following parishes: Our Lady of Hope (Rosemont), Mary, Seat of Wisdom (Park Ridge), Saint Paul of the Cross (Park Ridge), Saint Juliana (Chicago), Our Lady of Ransom (Niles), and Immaculate Conception (Chicago). **The Archdiocese has informed us that our grouping will be activated in February 2021 with the goal of implementing the new reality by July 1, 2021.**

We were originally scheduled to be activated either in late 2022 or early 2023. The adjusted timeline for us and for all remaining groupings is intended to accomplish both the need to address financial challenges posed by the pandemic and to move parishes forward to the phase of spiritual renewal more quickly than previously scheduled.

This brief letter is the first of more joint communications between us pastors as a sign of our mutual respect and collaboration with one another, as well as our desire to be transparent to you about this process. We have merely received, as of now, information about our activation, and we will be sure to communicate to you more details about timelines and strategies as we receive them.

This is an exciting time for the Catholic Church in the northwest side of Chicago and its suburbs! We are confident that with our communities working and praying together, Christ will be present and alive in the hearts of believers and that our Church will be strong for the future.

Please know of our gratitude for your dedication to the faith, along with our prayers for you during this difficult time in our world.

Prayer & Worship

CHRIST, THE KING (November 22, 2020)

The selection from the book of Daniel presented in today's first reading was part of an attempt to weave a vision of ultimate success for the Jews under persecution. Exactly whom the author had in mind when he refers to "one like a Son of Man" is hotly disputed by scholars today. The fact is, we simply do not know if the author meant anyone in particular or if this is a collective, figurative image of Israel's triumph. What we do know is that the early Christian community seized upon this passage and recognized it as a messianic prophecy, a foretelling of the ultimate triumph of Jesus as the Christ of God. The Lectionary's juxtaposition of this text with today's Gospel narrative of Jesus before Pilate is a wonderful example of how the liturgy "layers" passages with new meaning by inserting them in a particular context.

The celebration of Christ the King allows us to hear these passages with a new depth of meaning in light of our contemporary understanding of how, in Jesus and his resurrection and ascension, we have seen the fulfillment of Daniel's vision of ultimate deliverance. The veiled admission of Jesus before Pilate that he did indeed have a kingdom "not here" takes on new meaning against the cosmic vision of Daniel, who allows us to glimpse the "Ancient One" on his heavenly throne.

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Communion During the Pandemic

Prayer for Spiritual Communion during this time of uncertainty when we do not have full access to the consolations of our faith, we miss receiving the Eucharist at Mass. The reception of Jesus could give us so much comfort. In the church, however, there has been a tradition of Spiritual Communion by which individuals can receive Jesus spiritually even though not sacramentally. Here is a little prayer that can help us to make our Spiritual Communion.



*My Jesus, I believe that You are really present
in the Most Blessed Sacrament. I love You
above all things and I desire to receive You
into my soul.*

*Since I cannot now receive You sacramentally,
come at least spiritually into my heart. I
embrace You as if You were already there and
unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me
to be separated from You. Amen.*

Confession During Pandemic

The archdiocese has given clear instructions not to hold any sacraments. When we have extraordinary circumstances - just like what we are living through right now - the Church recommends that we confess our sins to God directly and make a perfect act of contrition. A perfect act of contrition requires sincere repentance for our sins and a firm resolve to amend our lives. We should promise that we will go to confession as soon as it is available. God forgives us immediately.

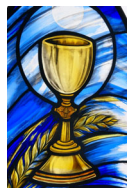

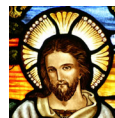
