FROM THE PASTOR

Palm Sunday is the final Sunday of Lent, the beginning of Holy Week, and commemorates the triumphant arrival of Christ in Jerusalem, days before he was crucified.

Holy Thursday is the commemoration of the Last Supper of Jesus Christ, when he established the sacrament of Holy Communion prior to his arrest and crucifixion. It also commemorates His institution of the priesthood.

Good Friday is the day on which we commemorate the crucifixion of Jesus Christ. Catholics are joined by almost all other Christians in solemn commemoration on this day. Good Friday is a day of fasting within the Church. Traditionally, there is no Mass and no celebration of the Eucharist on Good Friday.

Easter Basket Blessing will take place on Saturday at 11am. The foods in the baskets have a symbolic meaning:

- eggs - symbolize life and Christ's Resurrection
- bread - symbolic of Jesus
- lamb - represents Christ
- salt - represents purification
- horseradish - symbolic of the bitter sacrifice of Christ
- ham - symbolic of great joy and abundance.

The food blessed in the church remains untouched according to local traditions until either Saturday afternoon or Sunday morning.

The entire liturgical year culminates in the Easter Vigil, an ancient liturgy celebrated on the night before Easter Sunday. It was initially an all-night vigil that started in the middle of the night and didn't end until the first rays of dawn when the celebration of Mass began. For early Christians, it was a way to welcome the rising of the Son of God, who dispels the darkness of night.

I encourage everyone, especially children, and entire families, to participate in these most beautiful liturgies of the Sacred Triduum which commemorate passion, death and resurrection of Christ and His victory over sin and death.

This year on Good Friday, we will begin the Divine Mercy Novena as our preparation before the Divine Mercy Sunday, which is celebrated on the Second Sunday of Easter. A novena is typically nine days of prayer in preparation of a celebration of a feast day. For each of the nine days, our Lord gave Saint Faustina a different intention: all mankind, especially sinners; the souls of priests and religious; all devout and faithful souls; those who do not believe in God and those who do not yet know Jesus; the souls who have separated themselves from the Church; the meek and humble souls and the souls of little children; the souls who especially venerate and glorify His mercy; the souls detained in purgatory; and souls who have become lukewarm.

The novena prayer that includes the praying of Divine Mercy Chaplet will take place on:

Good Friday - before the Stations of the Cross at 7pm

Holy Saturday - before the basket blessing at 11am

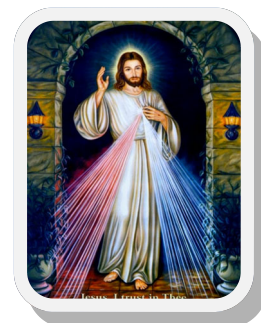
Easter Sunday - after 11am Mass

Monday through Friday - after 8:30am Mass

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Palm Sunday And The Easter Triduum

Palm Sunday begins the holiest and most special time for all Catholics. We reflect deeply upon the central mysteries of our faith, the Last Supper, the crucifixion and death of Jesus, and the Resurrection. These liturgies speak directly to our faith lives. Stewardship Reflection

In the prelude to today's great Passion Narrative, Saint Paul reminds us that we find our hope in the "emptiness" and "humility" of Christ Jesus; a life that led to the cross, but through the cross, to glory and exaltation. The way is not easy. Good stewards know that it requires a willingness to lay aside all rights of personal privilege; emptying ourselves in the service of others; embracing values different from the values of the world. It requires an understanding that to be "in Christ" means to be a servant because Christ came into the world, not as Lord, but as servant. What crosses are we willing to carry? What worldly values are we willing to forego in order to share Christ's glory?

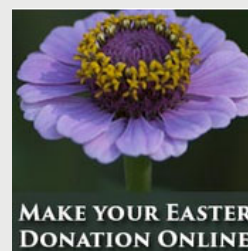

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Later this week, the Chrism Mass is celebrated in every cathedral in the world in preparation for the Easter Triduum. Only a bishop can consecrate chrism, pure olive oil infused with rich fragrance, so this liturgy is a sign of the unity of the local Church and the bishop's ministry to all who will be baptized and confirmed in our parishes in the coming year. Chrism is also used in the ordination of priests and bishops and the consecration of new altars. Two other sacramental oils, the unscented olive oil for catechumens and for the sick, will be blessed in the same liturgy and transported carefully to every parish by the beginning of the Triduum.

Remember when Noah's dove returned with the sign of the world's rebirth? The dove carried an olive branch, a pledge that God was breathing the world to life again. Yet olives require human nurture. Olives are inedible unless they are cured by human labor. Olive trees grow on sunny slopes, away from the shade of city walls, so they can only be properly tended, cured, and laboriously pressed in peace time. The Chrism Mass with its olive oils expresses God's deepest desires for us, and our resolve to place our lives in service to God's saving, healing, loving plan.

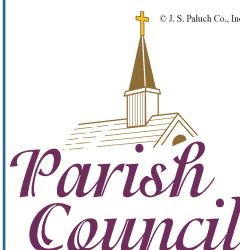

Concerns During the Cold and Flu Season

The Office for Divine Worship has received telephone calls and inquiries regarding the Sign of Peace and Holy Communion from the Cup during this current season when so many people are susceptible to the common cold or flu.

During this time it is important to remember common sense. While there are no plans at this point to make provisions for the suspension of either of these elements (i.e., the sign of peace or Holy Communion from the Cup) from the celebration of the Eucharist, everyone should exercise prudence. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal does not mandate a particular gesture to use in the Rite of Peace. The customary gesture is to extend a hand to those near. However, if one is ill with the cold or the flu, or if one feels the need, another gesture is perfectly acceptable. For example, a nod of the head and a smile could accompany the verbal sharing of Christ's peace.

In regard to Holy Communion from the Cup, communicants should always act responsibly. If one is ill he or she should refrain from taking Holy Communion from the Cup. Pastors and parish leadership should not at this time suspend offering the Precious Blood because of this season of colds and flues. However, all liturgical ministers should be sure to practice good hygiene, making sure to wash their hands, or to use a hand sanitizer, in preparation for ministering Holy Communion. Thank you!
