

What is the Assumption?

The first name of this solemnity was the Feast of Mary, Mother of God. Later, its name in the East carried over, the Dormition (or Falling Asleep) of Mary. In the West, it became known as the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

This solemnity celebrates the fact that Mary's Assumption is "a pledge of the future participation of the members of the mystical Body of Christ in the paschal glory of the Risen Christ." It shows that the Lord "reserves a munificent reward for his humble Servant because of her faithful cooperation with the divine plan, which is a destiny of fullness, happiness, glorification of her immaculate soul, her virginal body, perfect configuration to her Risen Son" (Directory, no. 180). The Mass has a proper vigil, and the solemnity replaces the Mass of the day when it occurs on a Sunday in Ordinary Time.

What does this all mean?

On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII declared the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, which the Church celebrates every year on August 15. Simply put, the dogma of the Assumption states that at the end of her life, the Blessed Virgin Mary was taken, body and soul, into Heaven. While this event isn't reflected in Sacred Scripture, it is clearly part of the Church's earliest observance.


In the sixth century, St. John Damascene wrote in one of his sermons, "Your sacred and happy soul, as nature will have it, was separated in death from your most blessed and immaculate body, and although the body was duly interred, it did not remain in the state of death, neither was it dissolved by decay; your most pure and sinless body was not left on earth, but you were transferred to your heavenly throne."

Theologically speaking, death is often understood to be a consequence of original sin. Since Mary was conceived without Original Sin, some theologians have wondered if Mary died or if perhaps she was taken into Heaven without experiencing death. The Catechism of the Catholic Church doesn't answer this question but simply states, "The most blessed Virgin Mary, when the course of her earthly life was completed, was taken up body and soul into the glory of heaven" (no. 974)

The Solemnity of the Assumption reminds us of the unique role that Mary served in the process of our salvation. Although she was without sin, we have the possibility of receiving God's forgiveness for our sins through Christ. Her entry into Heaven prefigures our own hope of experiencing the same eternal life.

Ordinarily, the celebration of the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is a holy day of obligation for Catholics, but when it falls on a Saturday or a Monday, that obligation to attend Mass is lifted.

The calendar of the Church is very deliberate in what we celebrate: there is a certain hierarchy of solemnities and feasts of the Church. Over the next year, we're going to begin to observe more of them, for they honor those whose lives point to God. They point out to us how to live our faith and they show us what God can accomplish through the fragile vessel of humanity. We'll publicize the upcoming feasts - watch the announcements and social media. Come to the liturgies when you're able. The Masses will be livestreamed, too, so if you can't be there in person, you can still celebrate this witness of Catholic faith.

Catholic Life Explained

Why do we do that?

Instruction of Receiving Communion

How many times a day can a person receive communion?

To find an answer to this question, we need to turn to the Church's code of Canon Law. Here we read, "One who has received the blessed Eucharist may receive it again on the same day only within a Eucharistic celebration in which that person participates...." (no. 917). This tells us that the standard answer would be that we can receive Communion twice in a day.

Having said that, we also want to be sure that we pay attention to the entire instruction. the phrase "within a Eucharistic celebration in which that person participates" is important. It means: a) that we always have to think of receiving Communion as being within a celebration of the Mass, and b) we have to be participants in that celebration - we can't simply show up "in time" for Communion.

So when would this rule apply?

For example, if you attend Mass on a Saturday morning and then take part in the Sunday Vigil Mass on Saturday evening you could licitly receive Communion at both celebrations. Or, another example, if you receive communion at a wedding or funeral Mass, you could also receive communion at a daily Mass or Sunday Vigil celebrated on the same day. We always want to be sure that we observe the rules for fasting from food and drink before receiving the Eucharist (see Code of Canon Law, no. 919).

We should also remember that the Code of Canon Law instructs that anyone who is in danger of death or seriously ill may also receive.



We continue to monitor and follow the guidance of public health authorities in our effort to keep our staff, workplaces and communities safe from COVID-19 infection. While the course of the pandemic has been unpredictable, cases are again on the rise in the archdiocese. Yesterday, suburban Cook County reached the threshold for "Substantial Transmission" of the virus and today, the Cook County Department of Public Health, consistent with IDPH and the CDC has published guidelines requiring masking on public transport and in health care settings and strongly recommending masking for all persons, vaccinated or unvaccinated in indoor public spaces. Their action is prompted by the high number of cases attributed to the highly transmissible Delta variant.

The Archdiocese will follow this guidance. Beginning now masks are strongly recommended for all persons entering Archdiocesan facilities in Cook County, excluding the City of Chicago regardless of their vaccination status. This applies to parish offices, schools, churches and other public spaces. More specific guidance on churches will be forthcoming in a communication to priests.

As Catholics who cherish every human life, we urge anyone who has not been vaccinated to please do so for the safety of all. Approved vaccines are free and easily obtained. As Pope Francis has said, "I believe that morally everyone must take the vaccine. It is the moral choice because it is about your life but also the lives of others." As disciples of Jesus, who preached and lived kindness for our brothers and sisters, we can do no less.

Today Maryknoll Fathers & Brothers are active in mission ministries in 22 countries in Africa, Asia and Latin America, as well as providing mission education and missionary discipleship formation here in the US. Maryknoll's ministries and apostolic projects include health care programs such as in South Sudan providing treatment for those with diseases of the eyes; care for and accompaniment of refugees; famine relief in East Africa; housing, education and care for street children in Bolivia; trauma healing ministry in Brazil; pastoral care for immigrants in Taiwan; educational programs in Kenya; clean water projects; chaplaincy and prison ministries; primary evangelization in Indonesia; care for the sick poor in Bangladesh.
